Salida High School will host a concert by the Salida Middle School band today, followed by performances by the high school band, concert choir and jazz band Wednesday.

The middle school performance starts at 6 p.m. today in the high school auditorium. The show will start with the fifth-grade band, lasting roughly 20 minutes, said Andre Wilkins, middle school and high school band director.

Sixth-graders will follow the fifth-graders, with seventh- and eighth-graders playing toward the end. The show will end with a few pieces by the newly formed middle school jazz band, which practices every Tuesday morning before school.

While the concert will include a few holiday-themed songs, the show will mostly consist of traditional concert band material, Wilkins said. He expects the concert to end by 8:30 p.m.

The high school show will start at 7 p.m. Wednesday in

the school auditorium.

The performance will include an eclectic mix of traditional classical songs, holiday numbers and some pop songs, Wilkins said.

Unlike the middle school per-

formance, the high school show will feature several individual performers, including a version of “O Holy Night” with three or four solos, Wilkins said.


