Stocks finish in positive territory

U.S. stocks finished in positive territory Monday after better-than-expected manufacturing data and Citigroup Inc.'s earnings overshadowed disappointing retail sales.

In economic news, retail sales missed analyst estimates as sales rose 0.4 percent less than expected, while manufacturing in the New York area rose at the fastest pace in 5 months.

In positive corporate news, Citigroup Inc. rose more than 2 percent after its profits beat analyst estimates with rising stock-trading revenue and a decline in losses on unwanted assets.

U.S. Treasury prices ended higher in reaction to the disappointing retail sales report, indicating a possible cue that U.S. growth may be slowing.

Volume on the New York Stock Exchange was low, with 518.17 million shares traded. Advancers outnumbered decliners by a 2-to-1 margin.

Best-performing sector was utilities; worst-performing was telecommunications.

Gold fell 70 cents to \$1,285, silver rose 4 cents to \$19.98, and crude oil rose 51 cents to \$106.46 a barrel.

The 30-year Treasury yield closed at 3.6 percent, and the 10-year Treasury yield finished at 2.54 percent.
